

## EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONSE INSTRUCTOR COURSE

You need to be an EFRI before PADI will register you as being in Teaching Status as an Instructor. We generally run the EFRI course a few days before the IDC. It takes about 1.5 days.

### PREREQUISITE

A current EFR or other primary and secondary care user level certification that is less than 2 years old from the date of the EFR course you will be taking at H2O.

### PREPARATION

#### Videos

It is advisable for you to watch the EFR Primary & Secondary Care & Care For Children DVD before attending the EFRI to ensure you are well prepared. This is essential if you have not done an EFR course in the last 24 months, have not done a Care for Children Course or are doing a crossover program.

#### Knowledge Reviews

Read EFR Primary & Secondary Care Instructor Guide – Sections 1 & introductions to 2 - 4.
- Human Body Systems  
Reading the Human Body Systems section - Primary & Secondary Care / Appendix / Human Body Systems (A-37).
- Medical Emergencies  
Read the section on medical emergencies at the back of the EFR Primary and Secondary Care Participant Manual (student manual). If you don't have one, let us know.



- Care for Children Instructor Knowledge Review  
It is found in the Care for Children Instructor Guide / Appendix / Care for Children Instructor Knowledge Review (A-21). Read the Care for Children Instructor Guide to find the answers.
